About Moot Court Society

The Moot Court Society (MCS) of National Law University Meghalaya (NLU Meg) is a cornerstone of legal education, providing students with essential practical experience through simulated court proceedings. Moot Court Society (MCS) is a critical aspect of the legal education at many law schools, including NLU Meghalaya. Moot court activities are simulated court proceedings where students draft briefs or memorials and participate in oral arguments. The society typically organizes various moot court competitions, workshops, and training sessions to help students enhance their advocacy skills, legal research, and drafting abilities.

At NLU Meghalaya, the MCS plays a vital role in preparing students for national and international moot court competitions, offering rigorous training and resources. It is responsible for selecting and training teams, providing resources, and ensuring that the participants are well-prepared to represent the university.

In 2024, the MCS achieved a significant milestone by hosting the 1st NLU MEG – NHRC National Moot Court Competition, becoming one of the first law schools to host a national moot court competition in its first year of establishment. The event, welcomed over 200 participants and judges nationwide, showcasing the society's organizational prowess.

Building on this success, the society has expanded into two committees— National and International—allowing it to focus on competitions at both levels. The MCS is now preparing to host an International Moot Court Competition, the first in North-East India, further solidifying NLU Meghalaya's reputation in the global legal education landscape.

Through these initiatives, the society not only hones students' legal reasoning and advocacy skills but also aims to position NLU Meghalaya as a hub for legal discourse and cross-cultural understanding.

Rules of the Competiton

Eligibility:

The Competition shall be open to students who are:

- Pursuing an integrated 5-year LL.B. programme in India; or
- Pursuing a 3-year LL.B. programme in India.
- An institution shall be entitled to send only one team to the Competition.

Team Composition:

- Each team shall be composed of three members: two speakers and one researcher.
- In the event that a team consists of only two members, both shall serve as speakers.

Any change in team composition must be intimated to the Moot Court Society, NLU Meghalaya at the earliest. Any change must be accompanied by a registration form and an authority letter duly signed by the head of the institution. No change in team composition is allowed after the formal registration.

The teams are strongly encouraged to complete the registration form at the earliest possible. Prior payment of the registration fee is required in order to submit the online registration form. Kindly refer to the event timeline for the registration deadlines; also, the registration will be based on a first-come, firstserve basis. In case a team fails to complete the final registration, the next team which completed the registration shall be considered for the final registration

Format of the Competition:

The Rounds of the Competition will be held offline and is divided into:

- Two Preliminary Rounds,
- Quarter Final Rounds;
- Semi-Final Rounds; and
- Final Rounds

The qualification of teams for the Advanced Rounds shall be determined based on their win or loss in each Preliminary Round. The top 8 teams with the highest scores across both rounds will qualify for Quarterfinals and progress through the Advanced Rounds, which include the Quarterfinals, Semi-Finals, and Finals.

Registration Details

Institutions must register for the Competition through their designated moot court society by filling out a Microsoft form, link - <u>https://bit.ly/4aObZda</u>.

The registration deadline is 15th April 2025, and only teams completing the form and paying the registration fee in advance will be considered registered.

The teams are strongly encouraged to complete the registration form at the earliest possible. Prior payment of the registration fee is required in order to submit the online registration form. Kindly refer to the event timeline for the registration deadlines; also, the registration will be based on a first-come, first-serve basis. In case a team fails to complete the final registration, the next team which complete the registration shall be considered for the final registration

While filling out the registration form, the teams have to choose a primary contact person. All communications concerning the Competition will be sent by e mail to the nominated contact person. It is that person's responsibility to convey all relevant information and distribute all relevant material to the team.

All teams registering for the competition shall be charged a fee based on their selected package. The registration fee, including accommodation and food, is ₹7,500 per team, while the registration fee with food only is ₹6,000 per team. All required transactions, i.e., the registration fees, must be paid online to the following account details: Account Holder - National Law University Meghalaya; Account Number - 50100682830687; IFSC Code - HDFC0004727; MICR Code - 793240007. Teams must ensure that the payment is completed as it is a mandatory requirement for successful registration.

Every team which has successfully completed the Registration requisites under the Rules shall be allotted a unique code after the closure of the Registration for the Competition. Once allotted, every team must use the team code for any communication with the Organizers during the course of the Competition.
